2025 Finance Summary

The two numbers below are a comparison of contributions to the **General Fund** that we use to pay most of the church's bills.

<u>2024</u>	<u>2025</u>

Total giving, however, also included some employer matching gifts, a few direct deposits and some transfers from the Parsonage Rent Fund which made that number higher, \$68,840.

At first glance, this looks good (our giving increased) AND our expenses last year (\$67,224) were slightly less than this income. **BUT** while we paid our bills in full, those **bills increased in 2025** causing us to also use some aforementioned transfers from the Parsonage Rent Fund **and** use some of the carryover from last year's General Fund ending balance to pay them.

The reality is, there is reason to celebrate but we also need to be aware this pattern will likely catch up to us at some point.

It's safe to say our largest budget expense increase came from our insurance bill which we can't control. In my opinion, there are no obvious expenses to cut so we are thankful that we have the Parsonage rent income currently (\$13,200) as yet another source besides the 3 mentioned above (plate, direct deposits and employer matching) to also use when necessary.

As usual, I thank God and this church for its consistent giving. It continues to amaze me what we are both giving, and unfortunately what our expenses have become.

Thanks for listening, and thank God for all the blessings he has bestowed on us.
